11 June 10h00, Commerce and Law	Honorary doctorate to be conferred on Mr Ahmed Kathrada	Veteran of the South African liberation struggle, Rivonia trialist, long-serving political prisoner on Robben Island and Pollsmoor Maximum Prison, ANC leader and Member of Parliament
11 June 10h00, Commerce and Law	Meritorious Book Award to Professor Hanri Mostert for <i>Mineral Law: Principles and Policy in</i> <i>Perspective (2012)</i> (in absentia)	Professor Mostert's book is an opinion piece, intent on providing insight into the mineral law regime in place since 2004, through critical discussion within the historical context. It comments on the political debate about nationalisation of mines and focuses extensively on the implications of the new regime introduced by the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act 28/2002 ("MPRDA"), especially for the proprietary relations relating to minerals that existed before the MPRDA entered into force. 12 June 15h00, Humanities and Science	Honorary doctorate to be conferred on Professor John Wright	Professor Wright, Research Associate at the Rock Art Institute, University of the Witwatersrand, is honoured for his contribution through his extraordinary scholarship on the pre-colonial history of Southern Africa and the significance of developing an archive that enables wider scholarship. His contributions have shaped this field and challenged the settler versions of history. His scholarship has been dedicated to The James Stuart Archive, a central source for the history of southeast Africa before 1910, which has over the last decade or so become quite popular among lawyers and land claimants because of the information it contains.

Based at the Haus der Kunst Gallery, Munich, Germany, his focus is African, European, Asiatic, North and South American art of the 20th and 21st centuries, the modern and contemporary art of Africa, and the contemporary art of the African diaspora.
12 June 15h00, Humanities and Science	Meritorious Book Award to Associate Professor Xolela Mangcu for <i>Biko: A Biography</i>	<i>Biko: A Biography</i> is the first in-depth biography of the iconic founder of South Africa's black consciousness movement. In the foreword to the book former President Nelson Mandela, describes Biko as "the spark that lit a veld fire across South Africa" in the 1970s. Contrary to the tendency to reduce Biko to the influence of Frantz Fanon, Associate Professor Mangcu locates the black consciousness leader in the long lineage of political and intellectual traditions that emerged in the African encounter with colonial modernity in the late 18 th and early 19 th century in the Eastern Cape.
12 June 15h00, Humanities and Science	UCT 2015 Book Award to Associate Professor Sa'diyya Shaikh for <i>Sufi Narratives of Intimacy:</i> <i>Ibn 'Arabi, Gender, and Sexuality (Islamic</i> <i>Civilization and Muslim Networks)</i>	What is the nature of being human within the Islamic tradition? What does it mean to be a gendered human being? These are two questions that Associate Professor Shaikh's book on 13 th -century Sufi poet, mystic, and legal scholar, Muḥyi al-Din Ibn al-Arabi, seeks to answer. She grounds her research in Islamic epistemology, and attends to the ways in which Sufi metaphysics and theology allow for fundamental shifts in Islamic gender ethics and legal formulations. In doing so, she addresses the wide-ranging contemporary challenges of our times such as questions of Muslim women's rights in marriage and divorce, the politics of hijab, and women's leadership of Islamic ritual prayer.
12 June 15h00, Humanities and Science	Creative Works Award to Professor Mark Fleishman for <i>Every Year, Everyday, I am Walking</i>	<i>Every Year, Everyday, I am Walking</i> traces the perpetual movement across the continent and towards Cape Town of a mother and daughter from an unnamed francophone African country whose home has been destroyed through violent action, and then chronicles the difficulty of their integration in Cape Town.
