- Cooperation between Cape Town and stakeholders can improve flood risk management in informal settlements, UCT study finds The City of Cape Town manages flood risk every winter in many of its flood-prone informal settlements on the Cape Flats. However, flooding in Cape Town is a complex socio-political problem that needs the shared responsibility of multiple stakeholders for it to be successfully managed, a study by UCT's Dr Joy Waddell of the Department of Environmental and Geographical Sciences has found. Dr Waddell found that each set of stakeholders does not always have all the resources, expertise, knowledge, and social capital to
