Schools Improvement Initiative Seminar Series begins

The University of Cape Town will launch the Schools Improvement Initiative (SII) Seminar Series at 16h00 on 29 May 2012, to bring a multidisciplinary approach to the problems of schooling in South Africa.

"Improving basic education is one of the social challenges UCT has identified as requiring an institution-wide response," said Dr Jonathan Clark, the Director of SII, which will be formally launched on 28 May 2012. "Through the SII, the university intends to engage practically, developmentally and critically with the problems of schooling in this country.'
