1,389 UCT students to graduate this week

81 doctoral degrees to be awarded in recognition of research on leading health, economic, political and cultural issues, among others

Altogether 1,389 students, including 81 PhD students, will graduate this week from the University of Cape Town, reflecting a healthy increase in the university's graduation numbers over the last two years.

The June harvest of postgraduates concentrated on hard-pressing issues such as HIV/Aids and tuberculosis, which continue to affect millions of South Africans. Others delivered innovative work in areas such as land reform; disability in the workplace; improving water and sanitation in informal settlements; reducing power stations' downtimes; the role of mobile technology in the social economic development of semi-literate users; interactive mobile lecturing; and digital storytelling and the preservation of South African narratives.

Gerda Kruger, Executive Director: Communication and Marketing at UCT, says: "The steady increase in our graduate output is a testament to UCT's commitment to train a competent, informed workforce, which we believe is critical in dealing with South Africa's skills shortage. At UCT we strive to deliver both workers and research that can assist our country and continent in tackling complex health, social, energy, economy and engineering challenges. Once again, I am impressed by the cutting-edge research conducted by our postgraduate students, as they focused on various subjects in these particular spheres that can help serve the needs of our people."

The graduation ceremonies for UCT's six faculties will be spread out over two days, 6 and 7 June 2013, and will take place at Jameson Hall on Upper Campus. The faculties are Commerce; Engineering and the Built Environment; Law; Health Sciences; Humanities; and Science.
