UCT to graduate 5,000+ students in December

13 ceremonies will take place from 15 to 20 December 2014 at Jameson Hall, Upper Campus, UCT

Next week the University of Cape Town will send off approximately 5,772* students with undergraduate and postgraduate degrees from across its six faculties. The university's end-of-year graduation ceremonies will take place from 15 to 20 December 2014 in the Jameson Hall, Upper Campus.

This month UCT will graduate approximately 106 doctoral candidates; 1,120 recipients of diplomas and certificates; 3,165 bachelors; 901 honours; 477 master's; and three MBA degree holders. This brings UCT's total number of graduates for 2014 (June and December combined) to 7,236* - a slight increase on last year's total of 6,964.

The faculty breakdown of UCT's PhD graduates for December is: nine for Commerce; nine for Engineering & the Built Environment; 23 for Health Sciences; 26 for Humanities; four for Law; and 35 for Science.

PhD research topics are far-ranging, including, for example, the threatened endemic of southern African seabirds; the depiction of Coloured, female murderers in the *Daily Voice* and *Son* tabloids; and the competitiveness of the Southern African Development Community's banking industry.

Other PhD research topics relate to new statistics applications in astronomy and cosmology; designing architecture for the secure sharing of personal records; and how intensive-care nurses' experiences of death can make an impact on a postgraduate nursing curriculum.

Research pertaining to Africa includes: the economics of climate change vulnerability, adaptation and mitigation in Tanzania; how drug trafficking activities have eroded the functional and juridical attributes of the state in Ghana; and the potential of community participation in conflict resolution processes to sustain peace in Northern Uganda.
