By naming the Humanities Building the Neville Alexander Building, UCT recognises the immense contribution that he has made as a scholar, activist, and public intellectual. 	Women in Science Awards 2015	Dr Gina Ziervogel, Senior lecturer in the Department of Environmental and Geographical Science and research fellow in the African Climate and Development Initiative won the Distinguished Young Women Researchers (Humanities and Social Sciences) at the 2015 WISA. Her work focuses on those most at need, and most exposed and vulnerable to climate change and variability, from households to villages and at municipal levels. Khanyisile Kgoadi, Department of Clinical Science and Immunology, Institute of Infectious Disease and Molecular Medicine received the Tata Scholarship because of her work related to: Central nervous system tuberculosis (CNS-TB) is the deadliest form of TB, with mortality rates as high as one in two. However, we do not yet understand the host immune mechanisms needed to protect against it.
