- **5th International Conference on Climate Services** The Fifth International Conference on Climate Services (ICCS5) will be held for the first time in Africa, and will host the world's leading organisations and individuals involved with the rapidly growing arena of climate services. - "Situational prevention of wildlife crime: The importance of information & analysis" with Dr Andrew Lemieux The Centre of Criminology presents a seminar with Andrew Lemieux. Wildlife crime is a diverse problem that affects protected areas and communities around the world. Finding solutions that reduce offender motivation or remove criminal opportunities requires detailed analyses that are crime-, time-, and place-specific. This approach requires those affected by wildlife crime to collect useful information that can be used for problem solving. Building the capacity of stakeholders to collect such data, and more importantly, analyse it, cannot be overlooked. Based on experiences in Africa and Asia, the seminar will discuss ways in which data-driven interventions can be designed, and what is needed to use problem-oriented policing and situational crime prevention to reduce wildlife crime. - "Gang performances, social mobility, and victimisation risks on the Cape Flats" with Dr Marie Rosenkrantz Lindegaard – The Institute for Safety

Governance and Criminology is hosting a seminar by Marie Rosenkrantz Lindegaard, an anthropologist and criminologist, senior researcher at the Netherlands Institute for the Study of Crime and Law Enforcement (NSCR) and an associate professor in sociology at the University of Copenhagen. Based on her longitudinal ethnographic fieldwork on the Cape Flats, Lindegaard argues that young men's occasional performance of gang repertoires is crucial if they are to avoid victimisation. She proposes paying particularly close attention to the association between social and spatial mobility and the risk for victimisation among youth in high-risk settings.

Book launch: "Human Origins: How diet, climate and landscape shaped us" with Professor John S. Compton – John S. Compton, associate professor in the Department of Geological Sciences at UCT, launches his book entitled "Human Origins: How diet, climate and landscape shaped us" with a free public lecture. Compton's latest book provides a narrative of our deep (or "big") history from the big bang to the present with projections into the future.
