For providing innovative solutions to enhancing and improving wastewater treatment



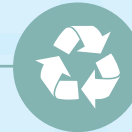

For welfare-related research in community-based HIV treatment and innovative HIV prevention work



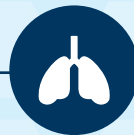
