- **Update and reflections from the Division of Public Mental Health by Faadiel Williams and Crick Lund** – Dr Faadiel Williams will highlight the work the Division of Public Mental Health has done over the last year, before the NSTF award winning Professor Crick Lund presents preliminary baseline data from the Emerald household survey on the household economic impact of living with a mental illness in Ethiopia, India, Nepal, Nigeria, South Africa and Uganda.

- **UCT doctoral research to inform the design of a neonatal HIV vaccine** – A UCT Faculty of Health graduate's thesis has put a spotlight on infants who are exposed to HIV, to inform the design of a neonatal HIV vaccine. Dr Elvis Kidzeru graduated with a doctoral degree at the June 2016 graduation. His thesis examined the impact myeloid-derived suppressor cells might have on vaccine immunity in HIV-infected or uninfected mothers and their infants. - **Cooperation between Cape Town and stakeholders can improve flood risk management in informal settlements, UCT study finds** - The City of Cape Town manages flood risk every winter in many of its flood-prone informal settlements on the Cape Flats. However, flooding in Cape Town is a complex socio-political problem that needs the shared responsibility of multiple stakeholders for it to be successfully managed, a study by UCT's Dr Joy Waddell of the Department of Environmental and Geographical Sciences has found. Dr Waddell found that each set of stakeholders does not always have all the resources, expertise, knowledge, and social capital to
