## **Background**

The University of Cape Town's Residence Academic Development Committee (RADC) is calling for new funding proposals. The RADC is grounded in a collaboration protocol between Residences and Faculties. The purpose of the Living and Learning projects is to further establish a way of bridging the gap between Faculties and Residences and to foster student success. Partnerships are not limited to the following themes for 2018:

- 1. Academic Success and Intellectual Enrichment programs
- 2. Mental wellness programs

Partnerships are sought which will contribute to student success. Programs are sought that have an ethos that includes among many others:

- Greater sense of belonging
- Student retention

The RADC encourages proposals that give consideration to and align with the university's Strategic Goals that are part of the university's current Strategic Planning Framework 2016-2020. Alignment with the Strategic Goals will be assessed according to the criteria outlined below. Proposals that more fully address and align with these criteria will be more favourably received.

#### The Funding proposal review criteria are:

- Does the proposed initiative promote inclusivity of all students living in residence, including students with disabilities? (And hence, foster a greater sense of belonging) [If so, how?]
- Does the proposed initiative encourage the widespread participation of individuals across UCT (e.g. faculties, departments, offices)? [If so, how? If no, is it clear why it does not?]
- Does the proposed initiative foster inter-residence collaborations? [If so, how? If no, is it clear why it is for a particular residence only?]
- Does the proposed initiative contribute to enhanced and innovative ways of teaching and learning? [If so, how?]
- Does the proposed initiative make explicit how it can contribute to students' academic success? [If so, how?]
- Does the proposed initiative contribute to a holistic living and learning experience for students? [If so, how?]

You are invited to complete the RADC funding proposal, up to R20 000 is available for the project per year. Residences/Faculties/Departments can apply for funding in each call per year, but they may not apply for back-to-back funding for the same project.
