

Who is eligible to vote?

A student must be registered at UCT for at least ONE complete semester prior to the election.

How many SRC candidates may I vote for?

- A student can vote for zero candidates through the abstain option.
- Up to a maximum of 10 candidates.
- There are 35 candidates running for elections.

How to vote via e-ballot

Online voting is available 24 hours a day from Monday, 18 September at 9am to Friday, 22 September at 11.59pm.

You can cast your vote online through the following link: http://bit.ly/UCTVotes

- 1. Enter your UCT login credentials: (Student Number and password).
- 2. Follow the instructions and cast your vote.

How will students with disabilities vote?

The Election Operations Office has made contact with the Disability Service to ensure that voting is accessible to all students with disabilities.

VOTER HARASSMENT

The UCT Election Regulations and Campaign protocol provide a code of conduct to promote conditions that are conducive to free and fair elections and building a consent culture. Some of the rules include:

- A voter may not be coerced into or prevented from casting their vote.
- No one can interfere with a voter's right to secrecy while voting.
- No door-to-door campaigning in the residences.
