Four postgraduate qualifications are available at UCT



Doctorate (PhD and others)

A degree requiring research at the most advanced levels, culminating in the acceptance of a doctoral thesis



Master's degree Either a research master's by full dissertation, a research master's by coursework and dissertation, or a professional master's degree



Honours degree A one-year degree consolidating and deepening expertise in a particular discipline



Postgraduate diploma (PG dip)

Enables professionals to undertake advanced reflection and development in a particular discipline or profession

UCT postgrads in numbers

Every year approximately 11 000 students (38% of total enrolment) embark on postgraduate studies at UCT, including roughly

2 200 doctoral students

5 800 master's students

1500 honours students 1 400 PG dip students

Four facts about postgraduate funding

- All full-time honours, master's and doctoral students are eligible to apply for funding to supplement their studies.
- 2 UCT does not offer full-cost fellowships, but it does have a range of scholarships and bursaries that offer supplementary funding.
- Most UCT postgraduate scholarships and bursaries allow students to undertake limited part time work.
- Applications for funding must be submitted before the advertised closing dates, so apply as soon as possible. (Don't wait until you have been accepted for your course.)
