- 3 After applying, applicants may view their application status and update their applications by capturing interim results, or uploading certain documents through our online self-service portal.
- An application for student accommodation is not a separate application but is incorporated into the application for admission.
- 5 Current learners should ensure that examination results from Grade 11 until September of Grade 12 (or equivalent) are submitted.

UCT's admissions policy balances merit, disadvantage and diversity

Our current admissions policy is located within the contexts of these objectives. Our system for admission is based on five principles:

- 1 Identifying applicants with the highest potential, recognising that they may not have achieved the highest marks in the National Senior Certificate or National Benchmark Tests due to the quality of their schooling or home environment.
- 2 Attracting the highest-performing students nationally, regardless of their race or degree of disadvantage.
- 3 Increasing the number of black and coloured students.
- 4 Reflecting a wider diversity of social class in first-year classes by increasing first-generation university students, students from underresourced schools and those from lowerincome households.
- 5 Giving students the necessary support to ensure a high probability of graduating.

What data helps us achieve these goals?*

The admissions application process asks questions that are aimed at developing an applicant's 'disadvantage factor'. These include details of the school they attended, their parents' and grandparents' level of education, their mother's home language, and their financial background. UCT uses the computed 'disadvantage factor' to weigh applicants' scores. Admission to each academic programme is achieved by using the three bands described below.
