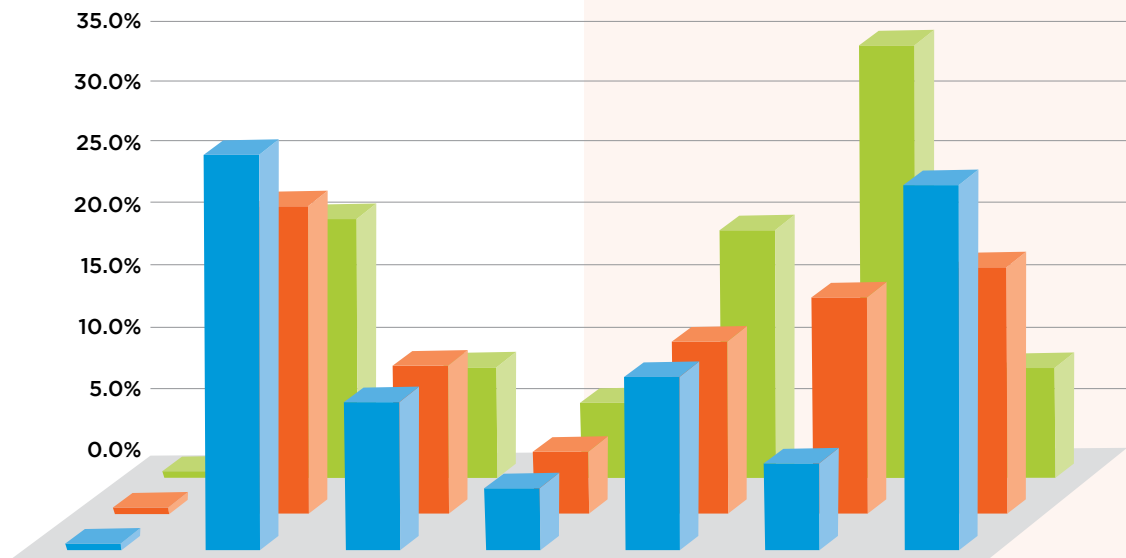


## UCT'S STUDENT DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE IN 2021

### Student enrolments by population group

While the university has made some progress towards student demographic transformation, black South African students are still under-represented at an undergraduate and postgraduate level, with white students over-represented at both levels. In addition, the number of black and coloured students declines at postgraduate level, while white and international students increase at that level. It's also important and revealing to note that many students (8–30% depending on level) don't declare their race - this could mean students don't identify with the racial categories, are resistant to the categories, or may be thinking about race differently to the university and its TDI agents. While the number of students with disabilities is relatively small compared to the overall number of UCT students, UCT provides unique and in-depth support.
